POSITION SUMMARY:

The CITE Steward will work with Orleans Parish directly in support of PC's National Science Foundation funded Communities Investigating Their Environment (CITE) project. The CITE project is designed to help tackle flooding challenges by co-developing the tools, training, and resources needed to carry out equitable community flood monitoring. The CITE Steward will coordinate project activities, including convening a community advisory team, facilitating workshops, and other activities related to community engagement.

This is a **full-time contract** position, with a flexible work week outside of scheduled activities and meetings. The position works both in person and remotely, focusing time in Orleans Parish.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Partner with Community Science Coordinator for project progress
- Collaborate with project partners and community members
- Facilitate community engagement in the monitoring, analyzing, and collaborative problem-solving of localized flooding
- Assist with recruiting community members for a CITE Advisory Team and Volunteer Flood Monitors
- Collaborate with stakeholders, including the public, throughout the CITE project
- Assist with facilitating CITE training for participants
- Maintain flood monitoring kits
- Assist participants throughout the process including data collection, entry, and analysis
